- 2. Through publication in daily newspaper "Ausaf" dated; 5th July 2020 general public was asked to submit objections, if any, however, no one appeared before the court, so ex-parte proceedings were conducted.
- 3. Petitioner No. 01. Mst Masta Meena (widow), 02. Muhammad Umar (Son), 03. Rasool Muhammad (Son) 04. Muhammad Zahoor (Son) 05. Muhammad Sabir (Son) filed the instant application.
