The accused/petitioner **Teh sil Khan** s/o Mir Ajab Khan; r/o Khwaja Qamarkhel, Shamsherkhel, Kokodara, Lower Orakzai - who was confined in jail in narcotics case, u/s **9 (c) CNSA**, by erstwhile Political Administration of Orakzai Agency (in case Report No. 3236/APA/L dated 02-10-2017), is seeking post arrest bail through the instant bail petition.

The allegation against the accused/petitioner, as revealed from the record of the case are; that he is a 'Hash Carrier' and that, on 02-10-2017, he was apprehended by 232 Wing of Orakzai Scouts at Chamanjana Check post (Lower Orakzai) with 170.1 kg of Charas.

Arguments heard and record perused; tentative assessment of which shows that:

- The accused/petitioner was subsequently handed over to the Political Administration without the case property (alleged narcotics).
- 2. There is nothing on record to show proper and safe custody of the allegedly recovered narcotics. No FSL report is available on record; neither any document is available to show that any samples have so far been sent or deposited in the FSL.
- No name or statement of the seizing officer or any witness is available on record.
- The alleged confession made by accused/petitioner is prima facie not admissible in law.

In these circumstances the accused/petitioner has made out a case of further inquiry into his guilt for the purpose of grant of bail. Resultantly, instant petition is **allowed** and accused/petitioner Tehsil Khan is directed to be released on **post arrest bail**, subject to furnishing of bail bonds in the sum of **Rs. 100,000**, from two local and reliable sureties - each in the like amount, to the satisfaction this court. Let a copy of this order be placed on record. Let this file is to be consigned to Record Room of District Courts Hangu after its compilation.
