- 2. Through publication in daily newspaper "Ausaf" dated; 09 Dec, 2020 general public was asked to submit objections, if any, however, no one appeared before the court, so ex-parte proceedings were conducted.
- 3. Petitioner No. 01. Safia Naz (Widow), 02. Lal Hassan (Father) 03. Mayi Jan (Mother) 04. Mukarma (daughter) 05. Saima Gul (daughter) 06. Muzafar Abbas (Son) 07. Hassan Raza (Son) filed the instant application. Savid Ali (attorney) recorded his statement as PW-1, Shoaib Ali as PW-2 and Gul Hussain as PW-3 testified respectively. PW-1 submitted his power of attorney as Ex.PW-1/1, his CNIC as Ex.PW-1/2, Death Certificate of the deceased as Ex.PW-1/3, letter from FC headquarter as Ex.PW-1/4, CNIC of deceased as Ex.PW1/5, CNIC of Petitioner No. 2 as Ex.PW-1/6, CNIC of Petitioner No. 3 as Ex.PW-1/7, CNIC of Petitioner No. 2 as Ex.PW-1/8, Form-B of Petitioner No. 4 and 5 as Ex.PW1/9.
