SUMMARY JUDGEMENT: 08.03.2021

- Brief facts of the case in hand are that the plaintiff, Khanwada, has brought the instant suit for declaration cum perpetual and mandatory injunction against the defendants, referred hereinabove, seeking declaration therein that his correct date of birth is 05.02.1985 according to his Primary School Record, while it has been wrongly mentioned as 25.02.1985 in his CNIC by the defendants, which is wrong, the date of birth of 1 ineffective upon the rights of the plaintiff and liable to instant suit.
 - 2. Defendants were summoned, who appeared through their representative namely Syed Farhat Abbas, who submitted written statement.

- During the scheduling conference within the meaning of order IX-A of CPC, it was revealed that the matter involved in the instant case is very petty in nature, which can be decided through summary judgement as per relevant record. To this effect notice was given to the parties that why not the case in hand be decided on the basis of available record without recording lengthy evidence, as the primary aim and objective of Amended Management Rules in CPC is, "to enable the court to
 - a. Deal with the cases justly and fairly;
 - b. Encourage parties to alternate dispute resolution procedure if it considers appropriate;
 - c. Save expense and time both of courts and litigants; and
 - d. Enforce compliance with provisions of this Code."

The relevant school's recordkeeper were summoned and the one Gul Yousaf Jaffar from GHSS Lodhi Khel, Kohat appeared as CW-01 and produced Admission and Withdrawal Register, the copy of which is Ex.CW-1/1 and the School Leaving Certificate of the plaintiff, the copy of which is Ex.CW-1/2 and that according to this, the date of birth of the plaintiff is 05.02.1985.

Learned counsel for plaintiff and representative for defendants heard and record gone through.

4. Record reveals that plaintiff through instant suit is seeking correction of his date of birth to the effect that his correct

date of birth is 05.02.1985 according to his Primary School

Record while it has been wrongly mentioned as 25.02.1985 in

his CNIC by the defendants. Plaintiff in support of his

contention produced the copy of the Admission and

Withdrawal Register and his School Leaving Certificate,

copies of which are Ex.CW-1/1 and Ex.CW-1/2 respectively

and according to which, date of birth of the plaintiff is

05.02.1985, which establishes that the date of birth of the

plaintiff has wrongly been mentioned in his CNIC that is

against the facts and circumstances. The available record is

sufficient to decide the fate of the case and no further

evidence is required to be produced by the parties.

5. Consequently, upon what has been discussed above and the

jurisdiction vested in this court under order IX-A and XV-A

of CPC, suit of the plaintiff succeeds and is hereby decreed

as prayed for. Defendants are directed to correct the date of

birth of plaintiff as 05.02.1985 in their record and in the

CNIC of the plaintiff.

6. Parties are left to bear their own costs.

7. File be consigned to the record room after its necessary

completion and compilation.
