SUIT FOR DECLARATION, PERMANENT AND MANDATORY INJUNCTION

<u>SUMMARY JUDGEMENT</u>: 04.02.2022

Khela, has brought the instant suit for declaration, permanent and mandatory injunction against the defendant, referred hereinabove, seeking declaration therein that her correct date of birth is 01.01.1980 while it has been wrongly mentioned as 01.01.1990 in her CNIC by the defendants, which is wrong, ineffective upon the rights of the plaintiff and liable to correction because the difference in the dates of birth of her son namely Sami Ullah and the plaintiff is 14 years, thus, there an un-natural gap between the plaintiff and her son. That the same is causing difficulties for the plaintiff as the defendants are not issuing her the CNIC. That the defendants

were repeatedly asked to correct the date of birth of plaintiff but they refused, hence, the instant suit.

- 2. Defendants were summoned, who appeared through their representative namely Syed Farhat Abbas, who submitted written statement.
- order IX-A of CPC, it was revealed that the matter involved in the instant case is very petty in nature, which can be decided through summary judgement as per relevant record. To this effect notice was given to the parties that why not the case in hand be decided on the basis of available record without recording lengthy evidence, as the primary aim and objective of Amended Management Rules in CPC is, "to enable the court to
 - a. Deal with the cases justly and fairly;
 - b. Encourage parties to alternate dispute resolution procedure if it considers appropriate;
 - c. Save expense and time both of courts and litigants; and
 - d. Enforce compliance with provisions of this Code."

Learned counsel for plaintiff and representative for defendants heard and record gone through.

4. Record reveals that plaintiff through instant suit is seeking correction of her date of birth to the effect that her correct date of birth is 01.01.1980 while it has been wrongly mentioned as 01.01.1990 in her CNIC by the defendants, which is wrong, ineffective upon the rights of the plaintiff and liable to correction. Plaintiff in support of her contention produced copies of 9th Certificate and Admission Register of

her son and the family tree of the plaintiff was produced by the representative of the defendants, wherein, there is an un-

natural gap of 14 years between the plaintiff and her son. The

said documents clearly negate the incorporation of her date of

birth as 01.01.1990 in her CNIC. Further, there is no

countered document available with the defendants to rebut

the documents produced by the plaintiff in support of her

contention. So, the available record clearly establishes the

claim of the plaintiff.

5. Consequently, upon what has been discussed above and the

jurisdiction vested in this court under order IX-A and XV-A

of CPC, suit of the plaintiff succeeds and is hereby decreed

as prayed for. Defendants are directed to correct the date of

birth of plaintiff as 01.01.1980 in their record and in the

CNIC of the plaintiff.

6. Parties are left to bear their own costs.

7. File be consigned to the record room after its necessary

completion and compilation.
