ORDER

DPP, Umar Niaz for the State and Sana Ullah Khan Advocate for accused/petitioner present. Record received. Arguments heard and record gone through.


2. Accused/petitioner, Lal Muhammad s/o Multan seeks his release on bail in case FIR No. 123, dated 20.10.2021, registered U/S 9 (d) KP CNSA at Police Station Kalaya, wherein, as per contents of FIR, the complainant alongwith other police having laid a picket were present on the spot, where a person having a blue colour shoper in his hand walking on foot towards the picket, was stopped. The search of the blue colour shoper led the complainant to the recovery of 03 packets of chars, each on weighing turned 1100 grams of chars (total 3300 grams of chars). Hence, the present FIR.

3. It is evident from the record that the accused/petitioner is directly nominated in the FIR with a huge quantity of chars recovered from his possession. The offence for which the accused/petitioner is charged, attracts prohibitory clause of section 497 Cr.P.C. Moreover, sufficient material is available on file which reasonably connect the accused/petitioner with the commission of offence. The points raised by the learned counsel for accused/petitioner involve deep appreciation of merits which cannot be discussed at this stage. Hence, the accused/petitioner is not entitled for the concession of bail at this stage. Accordingly, for the stated reasons, bail petition in hand stands dismissed being meritless. Consign.
